Her qualifications include SEND Diplomas at multiple levels, ILM Leadership and Management certification, and specialized training in Trauma Informed Practice and Mental Health First Aid. Through her work as a regular Irlen Syndrome screener, Kinnaird has developed comprehensive assessment approaches that engage teachers, parents, and students throughout the diagnostic process.

The certification of these practitioners expands access to specialized visual processing services at a critical time when awareness of Irlen Syndrome continues to grow among educators and healthcare professionals. Research indicates that approximately 12-14 percent of the general population experiences symptoms related to visual stress and light sensitivity that can be addressed through proper assessment and intervention with spectral filters.
